CLUSTER DAY Friday 1st March



Thomas and Louis had fun drawing pictures that match the letter 'l'


Hazel enjoyed using MAB to make large numbers.

Multiplication Arrays By Emme



You will be supported by experienced locals committed to making this event a fun, family friendly extravaganza the community are proud of.


