













During literacy this week, Pink Group have been learning about doubling the consonant after a single short vowel when adding a vowel suffix.

Geography

The students were asked to observe the features of the land in and around our school yard and note the interdependence of creatures to the vegetation & soil.

They were also encouraged to collect objects and record these using a chart. They went on two nature walks and used their five senses as a means to gathering relevant information and drawing conclusions from this.

Senior

Term 2 has seen a smooth start in the Senior Class. With all the positive routines established in Term 1, students have known exactly what is happening and what is expected of them.

In Literacy, a new Mentor text has been introduced to inspire their production of a Historic Recount. The text is about a famous soldier and Light Horse that fought in The Battle of Beersheba in World War 1. The students have completed their research into this story and the historic timeline it followed. We look forward to their own Historic Recounts on this story that they are now working on.

In Maths, students have reviewed their skills and knowledge related to Mental strategies related to Addition and will start looking into subtraction next week.

The Inquiry theme for this term is Geography, and students have looked into Anzac Day and the battle of Gallipoli. Students have identified the landscapes of where the landing took place and the significant historic names and locations around Anzac Cove in Turkey.

In Japanese Language, we introduced students to a wartime story that presented the significance of what the Crane (bird) has in Japan related to a symbol of peace. Students then attempted to construct an origami version of the crane.

Martin will be assisting our school with our Sustainability program and school garden each fortnight.


