

The previously arranged Dental Van visit to Moyston Primary School will not be taking place in August.

The school has been made aware that EAST GRAMPIANS HEALTH SERVICE Dental Clinic offers treatment to all Child Dental Benefit Scheme eligible families AS WELL as children 2-12 years that do not claim Family Tax benefit. There are no out of pocket expenses to families for EGHS dental services including treatment conducted after the \$1000 is expended.

Please support local dental services to ensure viability of the service in Ararat long term.

Accessing local services also provides continuity of dental care for children as EGHS offer long term follow up.






