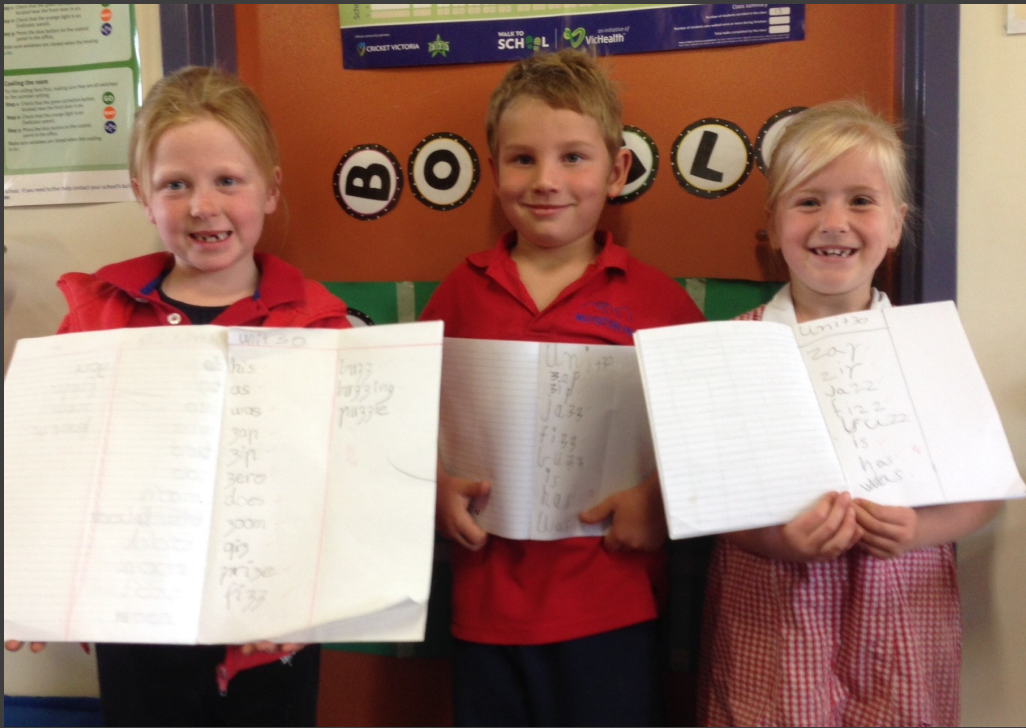
CLUSTER DAY
