READING EGGS & MATHSEEDS AWARDS

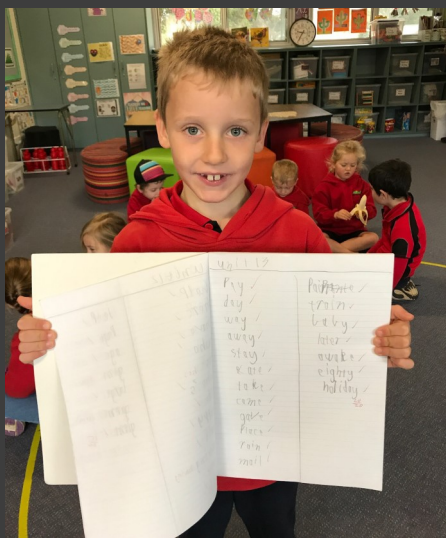
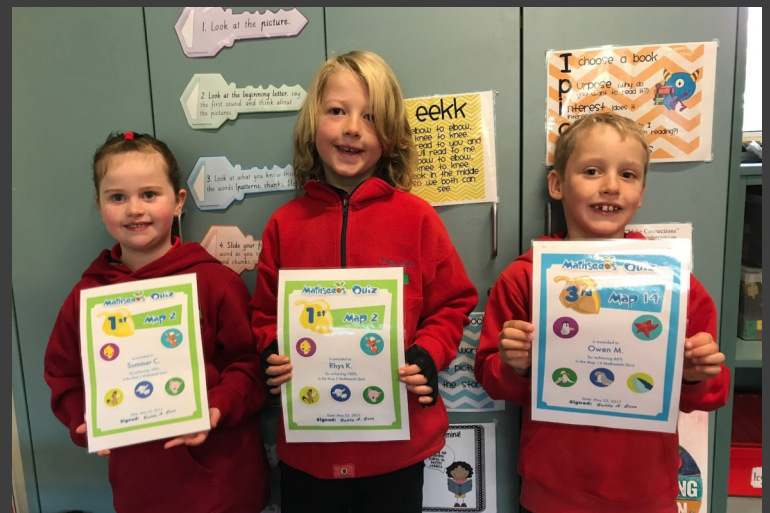
Well done to Adelicia, Ned, Madeleine, Summer, Rhys and Owen who all received awards for Reading Eggs or Mathseeds recently.

Students are able to log in and use these programs from home if they wish.

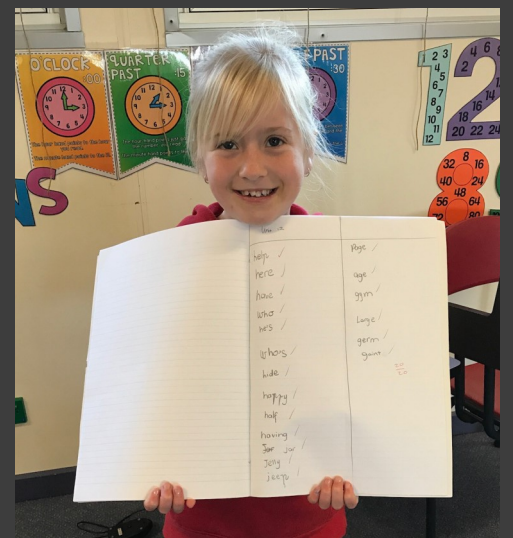
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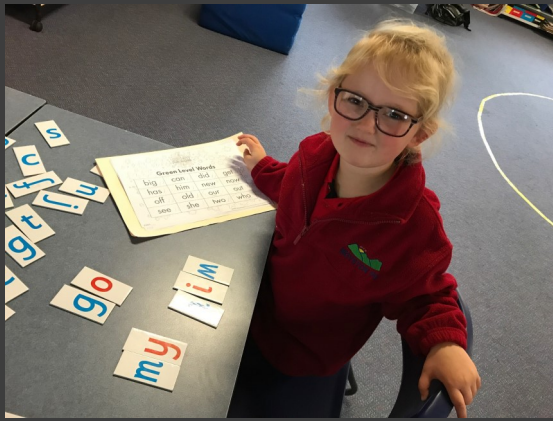

SIGHT WORDS

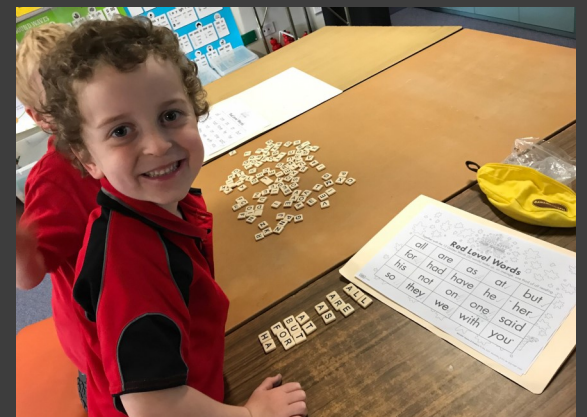
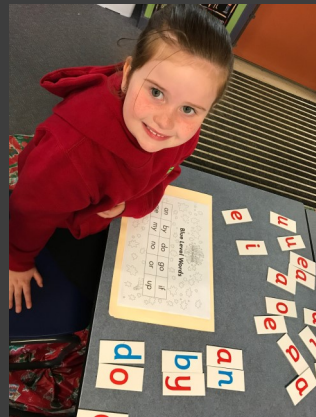
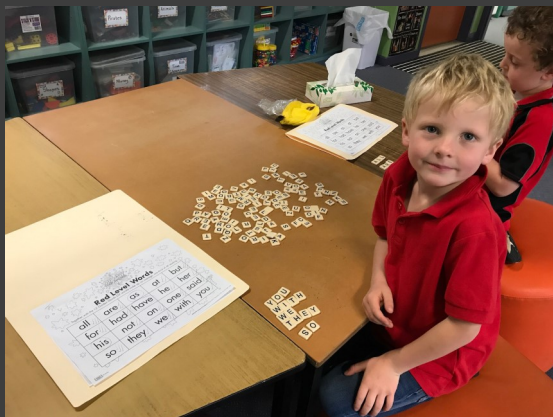
Our Junior students were busy this week making sight words.

Sight words are the words that appear most frequently in our reading and writing.

They are high frequency words that may not be able to be pictured, and as such, they simply must be memorised and understood.

Because of their high frequency, students need to be able to recognise, read, and understand them almost immediately upon seeing them.

By easily recognising these words, our students are more likely to approach a text with confidence and are then able to comprehend what they are reading.



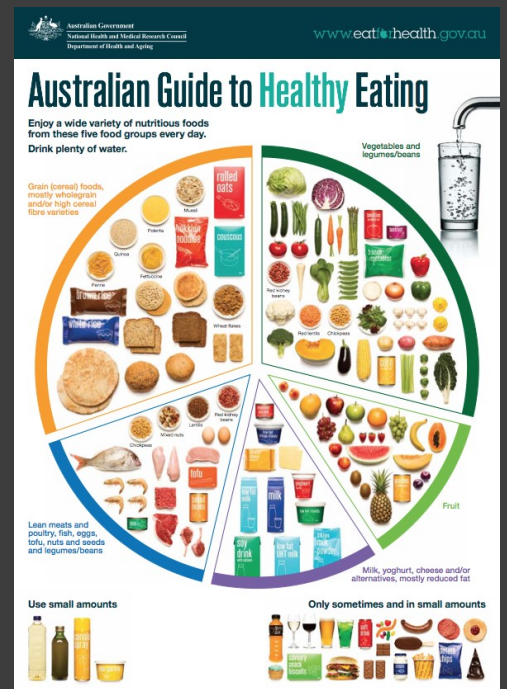
EDUCATION WEEK

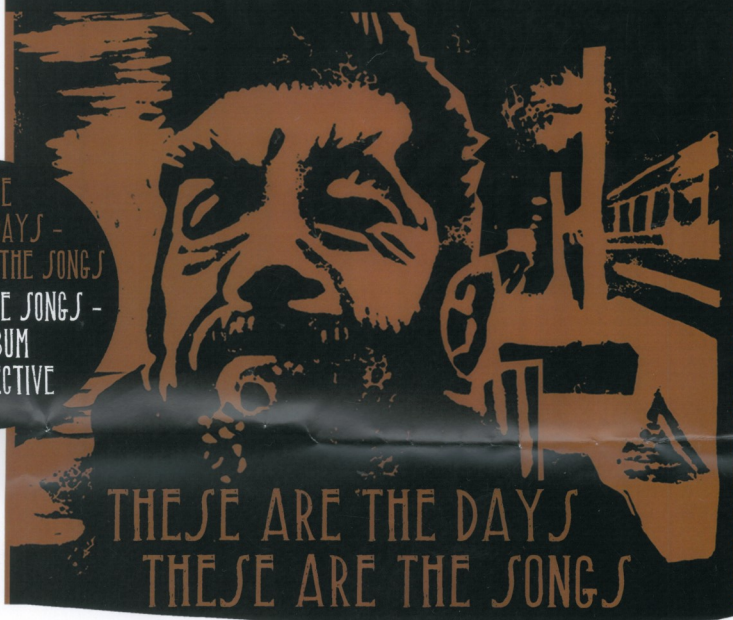
