Gwynne Decker

24/7/1936 ~ 09/05/2023

Moyston Primary School staff, students and families were saddened to hear of the passing of Gwynne this week.

Gwynne was a former student, parent and lifetime supporter of Moyston Primary School.

An interview with Gwynne from our Moyston PS School Newsletter from 2009

Gwynne was born in Ararat and started school at Moyston in 1942 like her mother before her. Her three children, Wayne, Sandra and Leanne also attended Moyston Primary School.

In 1967 Gwynne first worked at an old-time dance in Moyston which was held to raise funds to build the supper room. The dances were held regularly in the early 1970s and continued to raise funds for the tennis club, football and cricket clubs.

All these years later the old-time dance is still held on the 3rd Friday of each month and Gwynne is still working the door. The dances run from 8pm till 11:30pm. Jan Murphy or Rod McKenzie play live music and a home-made supper is supplied for just \$5 admission per person. Today the Art committee, the hall committee and the primary school take turns to provide the supper.

The old-time dances have an average of thirty people attend these days, usually with very few young people. Gwynne feels this is because no alcohol is served. The Moyston dances attract people from areas like Pomonal, Willaura, etc, where dances have closed down. Gwynne feels the old-time dances will not go on in the future because this generation is not interested. After all the years it will be sad to see a tradition like this one disappear. Gwynne loves the quietness of life in Moyston and enjoys the company of her friends. She walks daily with her friend Sue or her dog Maisie. She enjoys knitting, making a collection of footy cushions, blankets, teddy-bears and cork-screw scarves.

Gwynne deserves a pat on the back for her years of service to the Moyston community, always lending a hand.

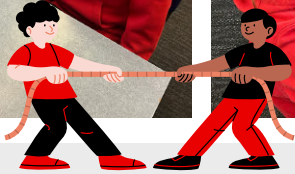

Mental Maths

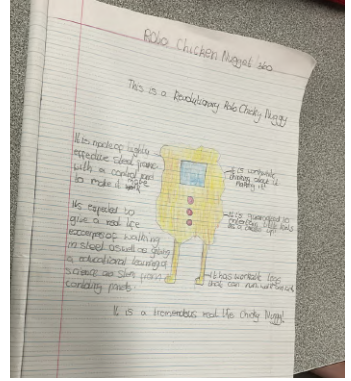
Siobhan sharing a strategy she just learnt about how addition is related to subtraction.

Senior



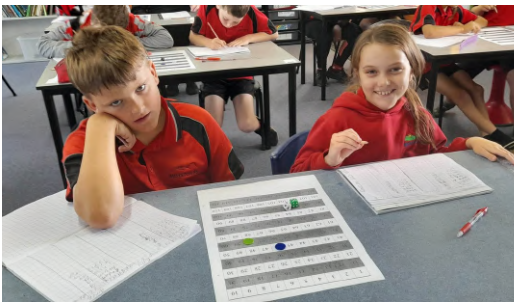
Senior students enjoyed completing a STEM Engineering Challenge.

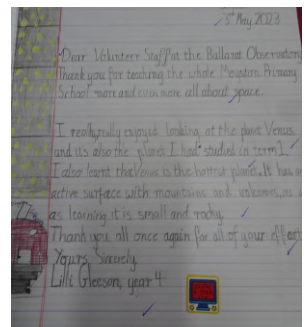
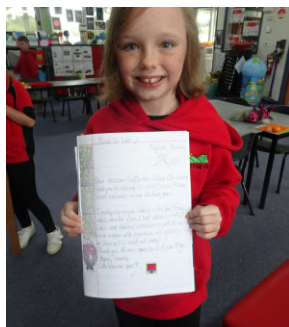
Where books are the treasure!
