LITERACY


Senior students have been writing information reports about an animal of their choice while exploring how larger concepts such as migration, industrialisation and deforestation are interconnected with their animals' habitat.


MATHS


In maths students have been exploring equivalent fractions, making connections between fractions and decimals, ordering and adding and subtracting decimals.

For their theme 'Civics and Citizenship', students are learning about qualities of elected representatives in the Australian government and key values required for leadership roles.








Assembly 28/7
