


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



For Writing, senior students have been exploring the book, "If I was Prime Minister" by Beck and Robin Feiner and learning to use emotive language to write good persuasive arguments.


MATHS










This week in Art students across all classes have been working on creating a square which we will put together to create a large tapestry. Some students from the Middle class have even been learning how to crochet!










Superhero Costume Parade

Parent Opinion Survey
