Parent Opinion Survey

While previously a random sample of approximately 30 per cent of parents/caregivers/guardians have been selected to participate, this year, all families are invited to participate in the survey.

We created our own mini oasis out of salt dough, sand and jelly. We have also been working very hard on our handwriting!





















Change Trains

The donation will go towards helping the students move back into their school aft the recent devastating floods. They will be using donations to purchase items such sports equipment, maths equipment and library supplies.


This money was raised at our Open Day last term and organised by our Junior School Council.
