

Students also enjoyed a fun hike to Venus Baths, and no visit to Halls Gap is complete without an ice-cream!


























Halls Gap Zoo excursion


We started our final week of school for 2023 with a whole school excursion to the Halls Gap Zoo!


Last night, Moyston Primary School celebrated 2023!


